NEW BOOKING POLICY

On May 1, 2024 bookings for tee times will only be completed online. To achieve this, an account must be set up beforehand. While a credit card is required to secure the booking, any of the regular forms of payment can be used at the course: cash, card, or punch cards. At no time will your credit card be charged unless the cancellation policy is not followed. At that point it becomes management's decision whether to initiate the charge based on the reason and the frequency of this happening

If you dont currently have an account, its an excellent time to take care of this. You can set your account here.

If you need any assistance with this during the winter months, just ask the pro shop staff.

GOLF COURSE TIPS AND ETIQUETTE

Own clubs – All golfers are required to have their own set of clubs. Rentals are available, but if none are present at the time of your booking, this is waived by the course.

Single golfers- Presently the course does not allow single golfers to play. Staff does an excellent job of pairing groups up or providing solutions to ensure you get on the course. You should always call ahead to confirm the availability of a time.

DID YOU KNOW?

Golf was banned not once but three times in Scotland between the years of 1457 and 1744. That's because the government believed it interfered with military training. In the early days of golf, players would golf publicly, such as on the streets or on business properties. This was seen as a nuisance.
